adjective

reckless and rash

He was getting too old for this temerarious behaviour.

hierophant

noun

an interpreter of the esoteric

Sometimes his tendency to fancy himself as a hierophant could get a little wearing.

ternate

adjective

arranged in threes

The barman set up his favourite: ternate gins.

inchoate

adjective

just begun

He marvelled at the potential of his still inchoate vocabulary.

asperity

поип

harshness of temper

He tended to display a certain asperity in the earlier hours of the day.

haptic

adjective

of or pertaining to touch, tactile

He sensed at once her highly haptic nature.

titivate

verb

put the finishing touches on

She paused before the mirror to titivate her hair, makeup, and décolletage.

plumassier

noun

a person who trades or works in feathers

No truly great outfit is complete without a visit to one's plumassier.

edentate

поип

having few or no teeth

fustian

adjective

turgid speech or writing

dysgraphia

noun

an inability to write coherently

horripilation

noun

goose bumps

The sudden outbreak of horripilation alerted him to her arrival.

demulcent

adj

soothing

He rubbed a little demulcent balm into his tired old face.

chrestomathy

noun

passages used to help learn language

He could say without fear of contradiction that his work was unlikely to be used as chrestomathy.

anosmia

noun

the loss of the sense of smell

Given his neighbour's unique personal hygiene regime, he longed to suffer from anosmia.

strafe

abuse

adjective

an inferior substitute

noun

noun

adjective

easily alarmed

behemoth

noun

bruxism

noun

verb (jocular)

splenetic

adjective

the back of the head

adjective

soothing

solidus

noun

forward slash character

noun

grimoire

noun

adjective

adjective

dull, dusky, gloomy

capacious

adjective

able to hold much

hoyden

поип

boisterous girl

pulchritudinous

adjective

beautiful

He continues to derive pleasure from her pulchritudinous presence.

anserine

adjective

like a goose

cacography

noun

bad handwriting

excrescence

noun

an ugly addition

He would be horrified to discover that his recent foray into facial hair growth was widely considered an excrescence.

tinctorial

adjective

of or pertaining to colour

meretricious

adjective

showy but falsely attractive

He wondered if there was any mitigating irony in the meretricious splendour of his colleague's new wardrobe.

prolegomenon

поип

a preface or introduction

He continued to ignore the indisputable fact that too many of his best jokes seemed to require a prolegomenon to ensure comprehension by the target audience.

prandial

adjective

of dinner

If anyone calls, he's partaking of a prandial pause.

fugacious

adjective

fleeting

Is there anything more fugacious than fame, especially for those unencumbered by talent, merit, or discernable character?

emetic

adjective

causing vomiting

He arrived marinated in what could only be described as an emetic aftershave.

fuliginous

adjective

sooty

There was a loud poof and in an instant the now fuliginous fellow realises the wisdom of not using flammable liquids to light the barbeque.

larine

adjective

of or pertaining to gulls

The esurient workers surrounded the tray of leftover boardroom sandwiches in a distinctly larine manner.

lunula

noun

crescent shaped mark, especially at the base of the fingernail

He was so nervous about calling him he chewed a fingernail down to the lunula.

picaresque

adj

dealing with the episodic adventures of rogues

impecunious

adj

having little or no money

lucubration

noun

nocturnal study (literally "work by lamplight")

borborygmus

verb

sesquipedalian

adjective

esurient

adjective

hungry

ebullience

noun

in high spirits

cachinnate

verb

to laugh loudly

rebarbative

adjective

repellent, unattractive

inveigh

verb

to write with hostility

ineffable

adjective

too great to be uttered

The new project team writhed in agony as they began to attempt to grapple with the ineffable hugeness of the task before them.

thalassotherapy

noun

therapeutic treatment using sea water

soporific

adjective

tending to produce sleep

verb
